The Department of Health (2010) and The National Prescribing Centre (2010) outline the parameters and principles for safe mixing of medicines and the nurse ' s role in this relation. Following these principles when nurses consider mixing of medicines they should always act in line with local policies, consult a pharmacist and obtain written instructions and also obtain consent from patients.

Role Of The Nurse In Safe Administration Of Oral ...

Meanwhile, meeting these demands, nurses have an important role promoting medication safety as part of patient safety. This includes, for example, risk identification during the process, responsibility to prevent and report adverse drug events (ADEs), and learning from experience . The generally regarded " five rights " principle (right patient, medication, dose, route, and time) of the MAP provides a basic standard for safe medication practice.

Registered Nurses ' Experiences with the Medication ...

Medication management is a comprehensive intervention which encompasses the knowledge of nurses and midwives (and that of other health care professionals) and the activities that are performed to assist the patient/service-user in achieving the greatest benefit and best outcomes involving medications (Naegle, 1999).

Guidance to Nurses and Midwives on Medication Management

You must always refer back to the registered nurse or prescriber if you have any concerns whatsoever, and should only take on any role around the administration of medicines if you are trained, competent and confident to do so within your organisation ' s policies.

As the last person in the chain, nurses have a central role in identifying and preventing actual and potential medication errors.
